## Brain surgery on live television

Hoover grad will operate on Stark patient Sunday on National Geographic Channel

Jonathan Miller will be performing the same type of brain surgery Sunday night at a Cleveland hospital that he has completed successfully hundreds of times.

Except this time, multiple

video cameras will be focused on the Hoover High graduate as he strategically implants an electrode deep inside the brain of George Grindley at University Hospitals Case Medical Center.

The sophisticated, high-tech surgery is being broad-

cast to 171 countries in what the hospital says is a first-time event on U.S. television. Bryant Gumbel will host "Brain Surgery Live with Mental Floss" at 9 p.m. on the National Geographic Channel.

Grindley, a 49-year-old

U.S. Navy veteran and former electrician, has the early onset of Parkinson's disease. He lives in the Lima area, north of Alliance.

The medical team will also implant a neurostimulator (electrical generator) inside

the patient's chest. The device and electrode will be used to treat symptoms of the disease with stimulation.

Grindley will be awake and conversing with his neurologists during the procedure.

## Phoenix Rising Behavioral Healthcare and Recovery relocating headquarters from Jackson Township to downtown Canton

**CANTON** Starting next month, 72 more people will be working in downtown Canton.

Phoenix Rising Behavioral Healthcare and Recovery, a nonprofit organization that offers psychiatric services and counseling, has signed a 10-year lease to occupy the former Trillium building at 624 Market Ave. N.

The business is one of several that has benefited from the city's recent approval of property and income tax abatements, which are designed to bring new jobs to Canton or retain existing jobs.

Deputy Mayor Fonda Williams, who is part of the city's economic development team, said any time the city can increase income tax is a win. But more importantly, he added, the new organization will provide important mental health services to Canton residents.

### TAX BREAKS

Phoenix Rising is moving from Jackson Township, which doesn't collect income tax, to a city with a 2 percent income tax rate. So Canton officials offered a seven-year, 50-percent income tax credit through a job creation tax incentive agree-

ment.

Last month, Canton City Council approved a similar agreement for Day Ketterer law firm, which was contemplating a move to North Canton.

**CANTON** Forget Jared. He went to The Rep.

If you didn't notice on your own, an ad at the bottom of The Repository's front page Friday was a marriage proposal. Robbie Paxton asked his girlfriend of 14 months, Tina Troyer, to marry him.

The longest seven minutes of his life followed when he set out the newspaper with her morning coffee in anticipation of her answer.

## Powerful Patricia slams Mexican coast

**PUERTO VALLARTA, MEXICO** Hurricane Patricia roared onshore in southwestern Mexico on Friday evening, bringing lashing rains, surging seas and cyclonic winds with what forecasters called a potential to cause "catastrophic" damage.

The storm's center made landfall near Cuixmala, about 55 miles west-northwest of the port city of Manzanillo. Record wind speeds measured earlier in the day had fallen off somewhat to 165 mph, the U.S. National Hurricane Center in Miami said,

but Patricia was still an extremely dangerous Category 5 storm.

Residents and tourists hunkered down in shelters and homes across a stretch of Pacific coastline dotted with sleepy fishing villages and gleaming resorts, including Manzanillo and the popular beach city of Puerto Vallarta. Patricia's projected path was expected to quickly take it over mountainous terrain that is prone to dangerous flash floods and landslides. Strong winds whipped palm trees and powerful waves rolled ashore in the storm area.

Among other tax incentives passed recently was an enterprise zone agreement for Ball Metal Food Container, which is pursuing a \$32 million expansion expected to add 100 full-time equivalent employees next year.

That agreement will provide a 10-year, 75-percent property tax abatement for the company.

The city has other enterprise zone agreements on the books with businesses that include AmbaFlex, Medline Industries and Republic Engineered Products, according to state data.

## PHOENIX RISING

Phoenix Rising outgrew its Higbee Avenue NW site, where staff serve 6,000 clients from four counties.

Lisa Grubbs, CEO of the organization, said the new address will make the agency more centrally located.

The building already is furnished, and because the previous tenants provided similar services to the community, the layout fits the organization's needs. And as Phoenix Rising continues to grow — it averages more than 100 new clients a month — there's room to expand into the finished basement. The non-profit organization plans to hire new employees in the next two years, according to documents filed with the city.

"We're gaining a lot by this move," Grubbs said.

Mayor William J. Healy II said switching a business from one community to another within the county usually doesn't constitute economic development. But in this case, the organization needed a bigger space and will now have the opportunity to add staff.

Lakebrook Properties — a partnership among local investors — purchased the property and renovated it, and the Jackson Township-based Putman Properties was tasked with finding tenants and managing the building.

The Stark County Auditor's office puts the 2015 proposed value of the facility at \$1.45 million. The complex will be named Polsky Plaza, in honor of the building's history as a department store from the 1950s to the 1970s.

Healy, who pointed to the organization's relocation as an example of downtown's resurgence, said that while he has a goal of being progressive, he also wants to preserve Canton's history.

"This is a great way to do that by recognizing names and historic landmarks to continue to move forward."
